- The 2019 Nova Scotia Library Association (NSLA) and Library Boards Association

Thelma Howley, a former CBRL employee passed away. Ian MacIntosh remembered her fondly "Thelma was working at the Glace Bay Library when I started here in 1982. - Year to date circulation is 204,643. In October 2018 our circulation was 217,000. The decease would be a result of Glace Bay's closure from May-September.

There were refreshments, face painting and a puppet show for the children. The afternoon wrapped up with a sing-along and stories with Anna and Elsa from the Frozen movie. - The Florence Library has been renamed the Wesley J. Stubbert Memorial Library. A new sign was erected and a dedication ceremony took place on Monday, October 28th. Library staff were unavailable to attend due to our in-service. A special thank you to the Board members who attended.
- Bill Conall, CBRL's Storyteller in Residence has been busy making connections throughout our region offering an 'Evening of Storytelling' program at the Louisbourg Playhouse, Glace Bay and Baddeck library branches. Bill will also visit the Ingonish Library this December to meet with their Book Club.
- One very popular new addition to McConnell Library's fall programming is 'Music for Tots'. The Library was approached by Andrew Hamilton, a father with some musical teaching experience to offer his time and talent to host a musical drop in program. We've hosted five sessions over the fall and have had between 40 – 60+ participants at each. Parents and children love this program.
- Nimbus organized a book launch for Lesley Crewe's latest book 'Are You Kidding Me?!' at the Glace Bay Library. Lesley was pleased to be one of the first programs hosted in the new Glace Bay branch.

- Mi'kmaq poet Rita Joe was the subject of a wonderful evening event in early November. Francis Sylliboy (one of Rita Joe's daughters) shared some of her mother's poems and memories of Rita Joe as a mother, poet, activist, elder and inspiration. This program was sponsored by NSPL.
